Step one: Observe external features. We will spend time learning how to draw what we see when we look at a foot. Programming your eye by drawing key points greatly enhances our power of observation.

Step two: Observe internal features. In this step we will explore how the inside of the foot greatly influences the shape and strength of the outside by drawing actual radiographs of a variety of feet, from healthy to pathological.

Step three: Learn the basic mechanical formula. Understanding how the forces at play influence the overall health of the foot can open up a wide variety of treatment options as well as preventative programs to combat common foot ailments.

As veterinarians, farriers and horsemen learn this three step process, they greatly enhance their efficiency as team members playing their respective roles. Don't miss this unique learning experience!
